

CARNARVON ST UPGRADE

Carnarvon Street has been subject to a range of improvements over the last 15 years, however, there is still a need to further improve the area to enhance the level of public comfort. The project will likely include upgrades to shade and shelter, lighting, street furniture, street trees, establishment of an entry statement with public art and a design which encourages easy discovery of key attractions (wayfinding).

The scope will likely also include providing communal meeting spaces, access to power and other services and upgrading existing event infrastructure.

The purpose of upgrading Carnarvon Street is to:

- Support night time activities and attract visitors and locals back to Chinatown;
- Encouraging connection of the pathways through the buildings that link to Dampier Terrace; and
- Promote private sector investment into the area.

The Carnarvon Street upgrade will include design, site services investigation, stakeholder engagement and construction required to provide pedestrian, traffic and stormwater management.

The upgrade will likely include:

- Traffic calming, shade and improved landscape supporting pedestrian movement.
- Lighting, street furniture, event infrastructure, multi-poles, bubblers, public art and entry statements.
- Improved pathways and connections between Dampier Terrace and Carnarvon Street.
- Crime prevention through lighting and encouraging night time activities

Business owners and landlords of Dampier Terrace are encouraged to consider enhancements of their properties to leverage their opportunities via the Revitalisation project investment.

CHINATOWN REVITALISATION PROJECT

On Wednesday 8 June 2016, the state government announced the Royalties for Regions investment of \$10M to undertake detailed feasibility studies and to deliver transformational projects, reinforcing Chinatown as the cultural, historical and commercial centre of Broome.

The Shire of Broome has committed \$2M to the project with Tourism WA committing a further \$700K which brings the total project budget to \$12.7M.

The projects identified to be key drivers in the revitalisation of Chinatown were mostly drawn from the Shire's 2013 Chinatown Development Strategy, developed following extensive community consultation.

The majority of funds will be spent over the next 18 months on projects that improve the aesthetics, comfort and functionality of Chinatown as a place to socialise and do business. Some funds have also been set aside to investigate the feasibility of more significant projects that will strengthen Chinatown over the longer term.

Implementation of the projects and oversight of the feasibility studies will be undertaken jointly by the Shire of Broome, Kimberley Development Commission and LandCorp. A Community and Stakeholder Reference Group has been established by the Shire and consultation with the wider community and key stakeholders will continue throughout the process.
